## **'All things bright and beautiful'**

As we celebrate Harvest Thanksgiving this year, we do so against the backdrop of a Creation that seems to be in travail. The frequency and intensity of Hurricanes in the Caribbean, earthquakes in Mexico, destructive monsoons in Asia, and the continuing drought in many areas of Africa, all serve to remind us that our world is facing grave issues in respect to our environment. While the exact causes of what is called 'climate change' are still under debate, there is little doubt that these changes are being intensified by human actions.

There is growing awareness among many Christians as to how we are called to respond to these environmental issues. It seems abundantly clear that we cannot simply continue as before. An annual service at Harvest time and using Fairtrade products, while good in themselves, are not now sufficient. Much more needs to be done.

But how are we to respond to these global issues you may ask? We could begin with the recognition that they are indeed global issues, ones that involve each and every one of us. We all have some culpability in their cause but also some responsibility in their remedy. We all have a part to play and we should never underestimate the significance of our contribution.

There are so many simple ways in which we can respond: cut out the wasteful use of energy, recycling waste, reducing our reliance on cars and fossil fuels in general. We all know about this but how often do we actually do it?

I was quite struck recently, while speaking to Primary aged children on this, as to how clued up they all were on the issue. For them the need to care for the environment was almost second nature. What was somewhat confusing for them was why the 'Minister' was talking about it to them?

My response was this. If God 'created' the world then it means that we didn't. If we didn't then it is given to us as a gift to be treasured, cared for and used appropriately. The failure of previous generations to do so seems to be self-evident despite the obvious truth that this is the only home that we have. We need to change our ways before it is too late.

So this Harvest Thanksgiving be thankful for the bounty of the earth and certainly share it with others. Reflect also on how we can both individually and as community be more respectful to our world. Consider how you could change your habits in ways that will make a positive difference to the environment.

We live in a world of many complex inter-related systems. It is a world in which every action, no matter how small, has a re-action and a consequence both for ourselves and others. Let us strive to make our actions ones that have positive and creative consequences.
