External Lighting:

In compliance with Canon 35 the congregation are being consulted on the proposal to install 4 LED down-lighters on the exterior of the south facing wall of the church. The low-powered lights will be on a timer and the intention is to make the church building more visible in the local community thereby helping to raise the profile of the church and the services offered. The cost will be around £927 for which a grant towards the cost may be available.
