Friday 5th - Monday 9th Holy Trinity Glenesk

Links Quiet Day: The Quiet Day held at Holy Trinity on Thursday 27th June was led by the Dean, The Very Revd. Dr Francis Bridger. Twenty people from the Diocese enjoyed the interesting and thought provoking talks and the opportunities for silent prayer and contemplation. A picnic lunch in the hall provided a chance for fellowship, the renewal of old friendships and the making of new ones.

St Salvador's Food Bags: Donations of food continue to come in from the congregation and these have been supplemented by a large donation of tins and packets from the residents of Hometay House in the High Street.

Notes from the Vestry: The vestry met on Wednesday 26th June.

Items discussed included-

Repairs: a broken window in the church had been repaired; the outside steps to the church need attention, also quotations are to be sought for a more robust fence at the back of the hall.

Fundraising: the general outcome of the Plant Sale and Coffee Morning was discussed and also the need to supplement funds with small on-going fund raisers such as quiz sheets.

Service times: The Partnership Group (4 members each from Holy Trinity and Holy Rood plus the Rector) had met and discussed Service times on Tuesday 18th June. They had not thought it possible to change the times until the beginning of October. So the Vestry agreed that we should continue with the present times for the Sunday service meantime. It is hoped that eventually we will be able to produce a rota that will enable both churches to have a Sunday service at 10.30am each week.
